The Delaware County Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) annually updates the Emergency Response Plans for all SARA Title III facilities in Delaware County. This action is necessary to insure compliance with SARA Title III requirements as well as Pennsylvania Act 165 and the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency (PEMA) regulations. The LEPC will also conduct a survey of general information relative to the transportation of hazardous materials.

The goal of the LEPC Initiative is to enhance emergency management response capabilities, promote strong partnerships between industry, public officials and responders, and to protect the safety of our citizens. The LEPC will work with each facility to provide any assistance to facilitate the fulfillment of this obligation.

The LEPC Initiative Coordinators will be requiring the following information:
(Digital versions in Microsoft Word or Adobe Reader would be preferable)

Updated Contact Information

- Emergency Contacts (preferably 24hr. contact for facility specific emergencies)
- SARA Title III Contacts (preferably one representative with two available phone numbers)
- Facility Contacts (preferably one primary contact and a least one alternative contact)

Updated Facility Maps

- Buildings (chemical storage identified)
- Roads Identified (if possible)
- Entrance and Exits Identified

Emergency Response Plans

- On-Site ERP (required for all facilities in the county)

EHS Chemical Transportation (EHS Only)

- Chemical Name
- Supplier Information: Contacts, Address
- Mode of Transportation
- Primary Routes: In and Out of Facility
